We had another good day at this qualifier. Our Novice team -Sharon Smith, Claire Lewis, Sarah Lewis and Sue Bridgwater- finished 3rd. with a two round total of 12 faults. Our Intermediate team -Keri Barnjum, Jackie Rixon, Thea Gibbons and Helen Vernon- took second place. Our Open team - Barbara Wood, Debbie Swan, Rebecca Sporne and Cathryn Row - won their class, with Barbara Wood also being placed individually first. Our Style jumping team was Andrea Kennedy, Sarah Pook, Helen Vernon and Rebecca Sporne. I'm not sure where they finished, but Helen Vernon won the class, and so qualifies as an individual, and Andrea Kennedy was placed fifth. Well done to all of them, and thanks to Team Manager, Keri Barnjum.

AREA 17 DRESSAGE QUALIFIER RESULTS

Our teams had to make a long trek to Moreton in Dorset this year, but came back with a good haul of rosettes, which made it all worthwhile. Our teams were:-

Riding Test: Carol Alford, Sarah Pook, Jenny Naylor-Davis and Helen Vernon. They won this class, which qualifies them for the BRC Championships in Lincoln. Individually Jenny was second, Helen third and Carol fourth -an excellent performance.

Novice Team: Keri Barnjum, Jenny Naylor-Davis, Tom Naylor-Davis and Emma Bowley. Rather confusingly Novice team members all ride a preliminary test! The team finished fourth overall, with Jenny placed second as an individual, which also qualifies her for the Championships.

Open team: Carol Alford, Sarah Pook, Jane McGibbon and Helen Vernon. In this class Carol rode an Elementary test, and the other members did different Novice tests. When the best three placings were aggregated we were equal fourth, but went down to fifth when the fourth score was used as a tie-break. Still a pretty good result! Individually Helen finished second in her arena, which qualifies her for Lincoln, Carol

was fourth and Sarah fifth. Jane McGibbon's usual mount went lame just before the event, and she had to substitute a 12.2h.h pony, who did a nice test to come in seventh! A great effort -well done. Carol Alford also competed in Medium 64, which is an individual class, finishing a creditable fifth. Our thanks to team manager Jan Desty who had a long busy day making sure everyone was in the right place at the right time with the correct gear.
